Paper Plate Snowman



Materials:

- Small paper plate
- Large paper plate
- Sheet of black card
- Scraps of orange, brown and colored card
- Round black stickers (or use white and color with a felt pen)
- Glue

Instructions:

- Glue the two plates together to make your basic snowman. Use the round stickers as pebbles for the eyes, mouth and buttons.
- From the scraps of card cut two twig arms, a carrot nose and a scarf. Glue these to your snowman. Add a black hat and hang your snowman on the wall for all to enjoy.

Snowflake Lacing Craft



Materials:

- wool or ribbon,
- single hole punch,
- scissors,
- pencil,
- card stock, poster board or construction paper

Instructions:

- ADULT: Trace temlpate onto a thick piece of cardboard (cardboard backs from paper pads or old boxes work well).
- ADULT: Cut out this template.
- Alternate Option: Allow the children to trace the template onto a piece of card stock, poster board, or construction paper and cut it out
- Allow the children to make holes around their shape (about an inch or two apart) OR have an adult do this prior to craft time.
- Provide the children with a length of wool or ribbon.
 - You can wrap some scotch tape around the end of the wool to make it more like a shoe lace.
 - Have the child thread the wool through the holes.
- Practice tying knots and/or bows to tie off in the center.
- Let the children use glitter to further decorate their completed project.
