## 5 Artist of the Month



Meredith Foster

Meredith is a New York born, self-taught artist, currently residing in Schoharie County, originally from Long Island. Primary influences have been Salvador Dali, Edvard Munch and Vincent Van Gogh, as well as nature in all its forms.

Using mediums such as charcoal and acrylics, ranging from animal portraits to surrealistic darker images, has been a way to express her feelings on canvas.

In January 2012, the web page Pawprints From the Heart was created. The passing of her Great Dane Elvira resulted in the first charcoal animal portrait. This sparked such emotion in others resulting in commissioned portraits of their own animals, leading to other forms of art such as seasonal primitive décor, custom crochet, wood burning/engraving, and jewelry.

January 2014 was Meredith's first showing at G Gallery in Bellmore. NY. Later that same month was Macabre Film Festival in Rockville Center. NY. resulting in an exchanging of gifts with horror legend and artist Tom Sullivan of the Evil Dead franchise.

By summer of 2014. Pawprints From the Heart had expanded to offer wood burning, engraving, and jewelry.

March of 2015 started to offer custom crochet such as photo blankets and pillows, hats, scarves, stuffed animals; including 3-foot-long dragons, mandala capes and hooded dusters, after only learning crochet within a year due to a car accident and major back surgery in June 2014.

During the years after that, she has shown her art at many venues such as small local art shows and outdoor festivals.

Quality being the motivator, every piece that is created is not just an order but is a one-of-a-kind piece and an extension of herself.
