COVID RESPONSE

The safety of staff and the public is a priority!

We have initiated enhanced cleaning procedures as recommended by the Center for Disease Control and our local Department of Health.

Library materials that have been returned or handled are being placed into a period of quarantine as recommended by the findings of the REopening Archives, Libraries, and Museums (REALM) research project.

To improve the quality of the air inside the library, the board approved the installation of a Needlepoint Bipolar lonization unit in our HVAC system.

NEW SERVICES

In March, the library began offering Hoopla. Hoopla is a digital media service that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, and comics with your library card.

Contactless curbside pick-up is available by appointment for those who would rather not come inside the library at this time.

We have expanded our selection of large print, audio books, and DVD by participating the 4CLS rotating circuit collection. This will allow us to make the best use of our space while at the same time, being able to offer new and popular titles.

SUMMER READING

Our annual summer reading program was fully remote and virtual.

Zoom programs included two readings with local children's authors, exploring the solar system with Cornell University's Spacecraft Planetary Imaging Facility (SPIF) program, and painting with Ibiyinka Alao, the United Nations Ambassador of Art for Nigeria.

We provided a different craft and STEM kit each week for children to complete at home.

Ninety-seven children participated in our reading challenge. They collectively recorded 19,401 minutes on our online reading app.

ON-GOING PROGRAMS

Book & Film Chat and the monthly book club are being held on Zoom. The 2021 book club selections are available. We will be participating in the Diverse Reads Reading Challenge created by Libby.
