

ADULT SERVICES



Crafterwork has been one of our most popular programs this year. Participants have enjoyed a variety of crafting opportunities during these monthly events. The Library also offered monthly book clubs and weekly knitters and mahjong groups. We were grateful for volunteer instructors and authors who shared their skills and talents, allowing us to benefit from a wide variety of high-interest workshops and learning opportunities.

CHILDREN & TEEN SERVICES

This year the Library offered a weekly story time for preschool children. School age children enjoyed a monthly LEGO Club and Animal Crossing Island Hop gathering. Some of the events the Library offered include a six week summer reading incentive program, a cemetery scavenger hunt, and our annual Sit with Santa event. Teens have enjoyed monthly meetings with fun activities such as candy sushi, terrariums, and cookie decorating. Free pizza is provided at every teen event.



COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

During 2021, the Library sought to expand the resources and services it was able to offer by working with community partners. We wish to thank the following organizations for helping us to make this happen.

Cornell Cooperative Extension

Through efforts with CCE, we were able to offer two virtual cooking series that got families cooking nutritious meals together.

Music On the Delaware

Through this partnership the Library was able to enjoy four music workshops/concerts by top-notch artists. MOD also co-sponsors in our Grant Roger's Project.

The Uplands Center

Grant funding provided the resources for a reflective art program for members in our community in recovery from substance use disorder on the grounds of the beautiful Uplands Center.

Walton Village Police Dept.

Community members brought their bikes to the library to be registered by the police department. Basic bicycle tune ups were provided and helmets were given out.

W.I.D.E.

Women for Inclusion, Diversity, and Equity conducted a series of multicultural workshops for families. We celebrated Juneteenth, Rosh Hashanah, and International Humans Rights Day. At each event, families took home a brand-new book featuring these topics.

OTHER NOTEWORTHY NEWS



In October, the Library held an open house event. There was live music, a tour of all three floors, and two public dedications. The library's local history room was dedicated in memory of Anna Sulger in recognition of her 49 years of employment at the library and her efforts in curating the library's local history collection. A plaque in the entrance to the library was hung to acknowledge the late Margaret Van Breeman and her monetary contribution that aided in the most recent library renovations.

RELOCATION OF MATERIALS



This past year, we were finally able to realize our goal of relocating our children's collection. Patrons can now browse materials in a space that is open and bright. There is plenty of room for families to read together on our window seat or on a cheerful carpet. Adult materials are now housed together on the opposite side of the library. Space between the stacks has been increased to allow for greater accessibility. Our lower level offers a reading nook with sofa and easy chairs as well as a designated play area for children.
