Browsing by Title



If you are searching for an article in a certain newspaper, you can choose from the homepage. The titles available are listed under Browse By Title.

The screen below shows the search results for Browsing by Title, in this case the Walton Reporter. On the left side of the screen you will see the print dates by year and you can click on a decade/year to narrow your search. On the right side are the individual page results from the search.



Narrowing Your Search

You can narrow your search by words or by date. Below you will find how to narrow your search by words under A, and by date under B.

The search bar image shown above is to narrow your search. The main feature of the search bar is the option to choose how you search for terms. The choices are:

-All Of The Words, which means all of the words you search will be found on one page of the newspaper, but not necessarily in order or together. For example, if you search for Ogden Library the results will have Ogden and Library on the page, but not necessarily in the same article.

-Exact Phrase, which would be all of your search terms exactly how you typed them. So, if you were searching for William B. Ogden Free Library, only articles with the full library title would come up.

-Any Of The Words, which means the results will show any newspaper that has one or all of the words you searched for. For example, a search for Ogden Library, may find a paper that has Library, but no mention of Ogden.

-None Of The Words, which can be used to enter a term that you do not want found.

You can search for multiple terms by clicking on the plus sign at the right side of the search box.

The other search box option is choosing a date range. This can be helpful if you know what year or month you are looking for, but not an exact print date.

Navigating the Search Result Page

Below is the result page of a search for Lewis E Steele. My search term is highlighted in blue within the transcript for each article. NOTE: Some of the transcripts can look a bit garbled, which is due to technology not being able to read the old copies of the newspapers clearly. To view the article as it appears on the newspaper page, click on the title of the newspaper at the top of the result.

After clicking on the crop button, you can move the blue boxes to highlight only the article you want. At the bottom right of the box is an X, which cancels the crop. There is also a blue arrow, which takes you to a window with options to download, print, or share the article.

After editing the image Step 3 will be the final window where you can share the article to Facebook or Twitter.
